Notification Regarding the Voluntary Recall of Adult SMART Pad Cartridges for the Philips HeartStart HS1 AED

Thank you very much for your continued support.

As announced in Field Safety Notice (QSR22-023/2021-CC-EC-012), it has been confirmed that the gel on SMART pad cartridges that are used in the Philips HeartStart HS1 can peel away from the pad in some cases. Therefore, we would like to inform you that we will implement a recall of M5071A Adult Pads (Brand name: SMART Pad Cartridge, Notification No.: 13B1X00221000048). We will provide genuine Philips updated SMART pad cartridge (that have passed Philips evaluation testing) for products that are listed in the attached List of Lot Numbers for Recall. When you receive the updated SMART pad cartridge, please replace the pads currently installed in your AED. Please return the affected pad and Recall Confirmation Form to us according to the attached Return Procedure Form within 4 weeks after receiving the updated SMART pad cartridge.

Recall procedures for the M5072A Infant/Child Pads will be announced at a later date.
