DreamWear – Nasal or Silicone Pillows Cushions

- Designed for your patients' comfort^{3,4,5}
- The DreamWear mask with Nasal Cushion is our most minimal design – cushion rests under your nose, not on it.⁶
- The innovative Silicone Pillows design causes less redness, discomfort and irritation on the face, nose and nostrils.⁵

DreamWear – Full Face

- Designed to prevent red marks and discomfort on the nose bridge.⁵
- Magnetic clips for quick assembly and release.*

Pico - Nasal

- Minimal contact nasal mask that is lightweight and small.
- Pico offers simplicity, comfort and seal with the freedom to watch TV or read while wearing it.8



Amara View – Full Face

- Innovative tube in front design offers an open field of vision and helps prevent red marks, discomfort or irritation on the nose bridge.⁷
- One frame for three cushion sizes (S,M,L).



FitLife – Total Full Face

- Unrestricted view.
- Large surface area.
