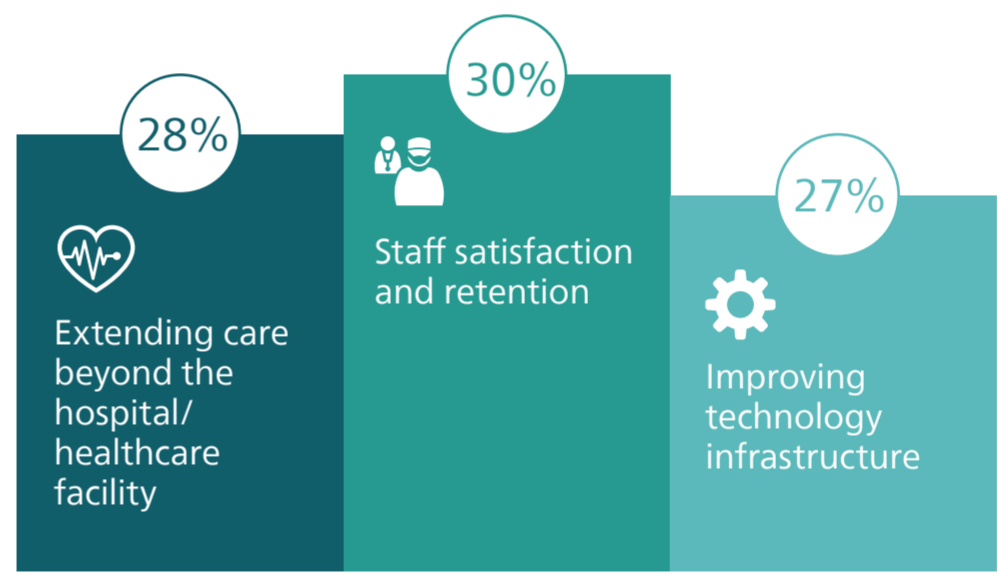
Cardiology leaders are reassessing their priorities as they navigate a new world

Emerging from the pandemic, cardiology leaders identify three key challenges for 2022 and beyond.

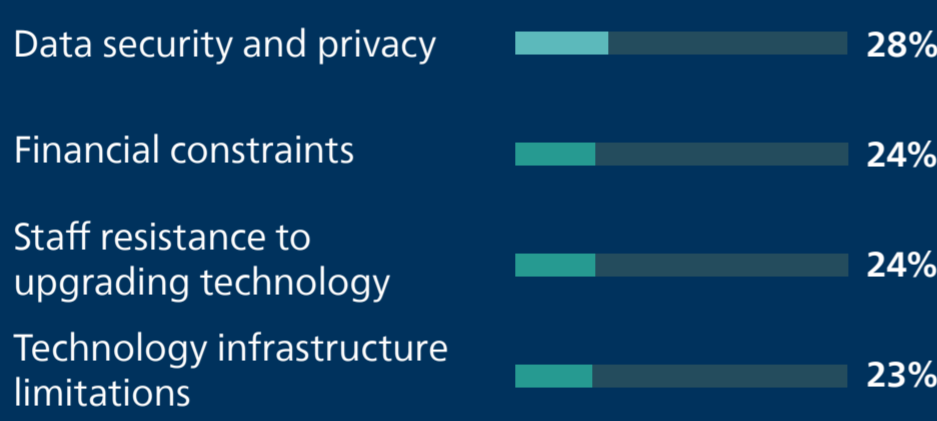
Focusing on patient-centered care through investments in technology

Extending care delivery and improving technology infrastructure are top of mind for cardiology leaders. Addressing these should help deliver another top priority: improving staff satisfaction and retention.

Top barriers to better use of data



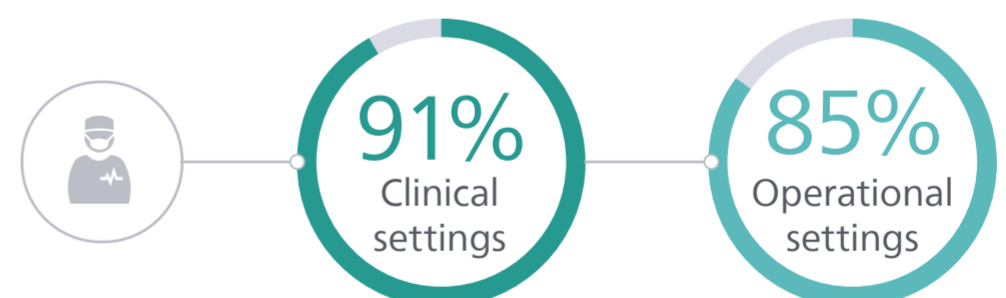
Cardiologists are confident in data, but hurdles to adoption remain

Cardiology leaders have confidence in the data available to them and are investing in digital infrastructures but are more likely to face data-related challenges. 58% of cardiologists agree that the use of data in their facility is more of a burden than an asset compared to 46% of leaders globally.

Cardiology leaders recognise the potential of predictive analytics

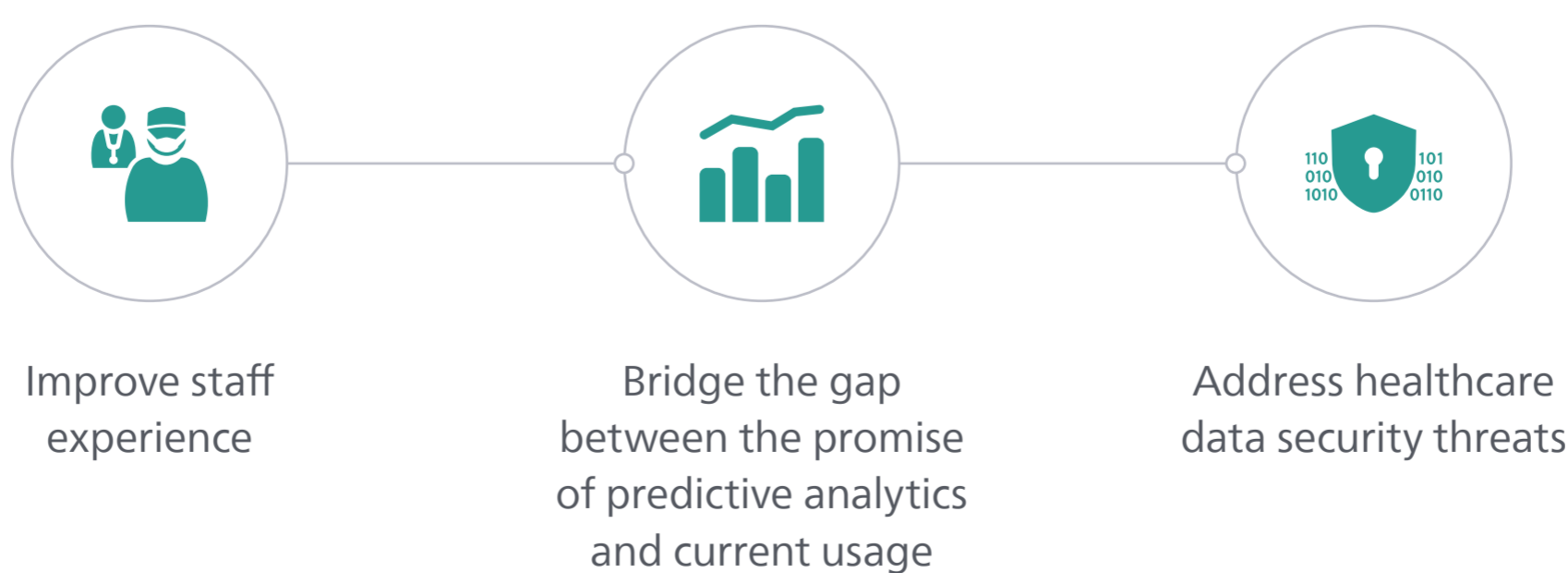
Cardiology leaders are confident predictive analytics can have a positive impact on patient care. The majority agree that the technology can be beneficial in clinical and operational settings with the biggest benefit seen in predictive maintenance (27%) and remote patient monitoring (26%).
